Kenya finally approves Loon internet balloons

- 1 High speed, internet balloons developed by Google's parent company, Alphabet, have finally been approved for use in Kenya, after president Uhuru Kenyatta fast-tracked regulatory approval to ¹**boost** communications capabilities to help fight the spread of the coronavirus.
- 2 The ambitious project, a joint venture between Alphabet's Loon and the country's third-biggest telecoms operator, Telkom Kenya, planned to use giant balloons to beam 4G data services to ²**remote** parts of the country but had been held up for almost two years pending approvals from the aviation authority and the Ministry of Transport.
- 3 On Monday, Mr Kenyatta said those approvals had been granted as part of a "raft of measures to mitigate the disruptions to our life arising from the pandemic".
- 4 Cases of the coronavirus in Africa have so far ³**lagged behind** many other parts of the world, but experts fear that fragile healthcare systems and crowded informal settlements in countries like Kenya could be overrun if the disease spreads. Kenya has so far recorded 15 confirmed cases of Covid-19, according to the Health Ministry.
- 5 Telkom Kenya said the global coronavirus outbreak had provided a need for "⁴**enhanced** connectivity", adding that the balloons, which will be launched from sites in the US to a height of 20km above the earth's surface and then remotely piloted to Kenya, should arrive in the "next few weeks".
- 6 Alastair Westgarth, Loon chief executive, described the regulatory approvals as "a ⁵**critical** step in our efforts to provide service in Kenya on a sustained basis".
- 7 Mr Westgarth added that the coronavirus outbreak had reduced Loon's operational capacity at its launch sites in the US but that ⁶**groundwork** already completed in Kenya meant the company was still able to deliver the service.
- 8 "We're confident that we can address these challenges and begin providing meaningful service to Kenyans in the near future," said Mr Westgarth.
